### 29. MUSEUM OF THE CHEROKEE INDIAN

Totally renovated in 1998, this museum offers new high-tech exhibits and an extensive artifact collection. Special section chronicles Thomas' Legion, a Civil War regiment composed partly of Cherokee Indians. This unit fired the last shots of the war in N.C. Fee.
